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1. GENERAL INFORMATION

The ISU Bocconi Scholarship, provided by Luigi Bocconi University with the support of the Lombardy Region, stands as a **significant benefit** accessible to students of the university.

Distinguished by Bocconi4Education, this scholarship ensures fixed benefits to eligible candidates who fulfill all requirements.

1.1 FIXED ELEMENTS

1. Full Tuition Waiver: This encompasses a complete exemption from tuition fees.
2. Access to Preferential Rate Canteen Service and Daily Meal Allowance: Eligible students can access the university canteen at a reduced rate and receive a daily meal allowance of approximately €818.
3. Opportunity for Part-Time Employment: Students have the chance to undertake part-time work for up to 200 hours.

1.1.1 WHAT KIND OF PARTIAL JOB?

Part time work involves tasks related to the **University services**, excluding teaching, exam administration, or administrative duties. The total duration of collaborations can't exceed 200 hours during the academic year 2026-2027 starting from November 2026 to October 2027.

Those interested in collaborations must express availability during the ISU Scholarship application process for the academic year 2026-2027. There will be a ranking to decide who will get the part time job first.

1.2 EVENTUAL ELEMENTS

1.2.1 ADDITIONAL CASH BENEFIT

The potential for an extra cash benefit exists beyond mere tuition relief. The determination of this **benefit** hinges on three key criteria:

1. ISEE Level Placement: Students are categorized into one of three bands based on their ISEE level.
2. "Out of Course" Status Possibility: Whether a student falls under the status of "out of course."
3. Residency Status: Students' residency status is categorized into three possibilities: Student from Milan, Commuter student, Non-resident student.

The **combination** of these factors results in varying benefit amounts, if applicable. Refer to the table below for a comprehensive breakdown of potential benefit combinations:

The **three bands** are defined as follow:

Following the allocation of regional funds in January, the recipients for the **first round of assignments** are determined. Subsequently, based on the regional funds received by September, the recipients for the **second round of assignments** are determined. If additional funds become available, even from sources other than the Lombardy Region, the final round of assignments could occur by December 2027.

The scholarship payment will be disbursed to eligible recipients in two installments, each equal to half of the total scholarship amount, and only via wire transfer to an Italian current account in the name of the student recipient or jointly in their name. The first installment of the ISU Bocconi Scholarship will be processed by approximately the end of December 2026.

The **deadline for the second installment** varies based on the recipient student's academic year of study:

- For students beyond their first year of program and PhD students, payment is scheduled by July 31, 2027.
- For eligible recipients who have attained the required number of credits by the deadline of August 10, 2027, and whose scholarship has not been **revoked**, payment will be processed not earlier than October 2027.

On the other hand, the cash scholarship for students eligible in the **second round of assignments** is paid in a single installment, approximately within the month of November 2027.

1.2.2 PREFERENTIAL RATE HOUSING: ---

The preferential rate housing in one of the Bocconi's Residences follow the same parameters of the ISU scholarship, but it's important to highlight that you must do a **different application** available on the site between the 17th and 24th of February 2026.

1.2.3 CONTRIBUTES TO INTERNATIONAL MOBILITIES: ---

If the University organizes the distribution of sums of money for those who go in exchange, people with ISU will be the first to get them if they depart.

2. DEADLINES

Here you can find the deadlines to apply for the ISU scholarships depending on your course's year and your enrollment session.

IMPORTANT: The application for the ISU Bocconi Scholarship for the A.Y. 2026-2027 can be done, for freshmen, **only after** you have completed the application for the "Bocconi4Access to Education A.A 2026-2027". The **results** will come out in about 10 weeks after the applications' closure.

3. REQUIREMENTS

3.1 ECONOMIC REQUIREMENTS

For the A.Y. 2026-2027 the Lombardy Region has defined the following requirements:

1. ISEE/ISEEU not exceeding 26.516,70 euros;
2. ISPE/ISPEU not exceeding 57.645,03 euros;

Each year, the Resolution of the Regional Council of the Lombardy Region, typically published around July 2026, delineates the criteria and funding projections for the allocation of benefits aimed at supporting the Right to University Education. This resolution also specifies the amounts of scholarships and sets the upper limits for the ISEE/ISEEU and ISPE/ISPEU indicators, crucial for accessing the benefits available for the academic year 2026-2027.

Should the upper limits of the ISEE/ISEEU parificato and ISPE/ISPEU parificato indicators for the academic year 2026-2027 be raised as a result of the D.G.R 2026, the final ISU Bocconi Scholarship Application Requirements and Regulations 2026-2027 will include provisions for **reopening the application process**. Specifically, the deadlines for the ISU Bocconi Scholarship Application for the academic year 2026-27, initially set from August 24th to September 4th 2026, will be extended exclusively for students who may potentially fall within the revised upper limits of the ISEE/ISEEU parificato and ISPE/ISPEU parificato indicators. These adjustments will be reflected in the updated ISU Bocconi Scholarship Application Requirements and Regulations 2026-2027.

3.2 MERIT REQUIREMENTS

3.2.1 CONFIRMATION FOR EVERY YEAR AFTER THE FIRST

You need to send an application for the ISU Scholarship each year. As such, starting from the end of the first year you will need a certain number of credits to be able to correctly send the application. Here there is the table with all the amounts needed (CLMG=Law; O.C.=Out of Course; CDL=University Courses, both in English or in Italian)

What happens if these criteria aren't met by August 10, 2026? You will simply be ineligible to apply for the scholarship for the subsequent year.

3.2.2 EX POST CONFIRMATION FOR THE FIRST YEAR

For the first year, however, the situation is notably different. While there is still a merit requirement, given that students are transitioning from high school and have yet to take university exams, the University has opted to evaluate this criterion retrospectively. Initially, scholarships are granted regardless of merit. However, by **August 10, 2027**, undergraduate and law students must accumulate a minimum of 44 credits, and master's students must accumulate at least 39 credits to maintain eligibility in the first year.

What happens if these requirements aren't fulfilled? The scholarship will be **revoked**. The affected student, whether they were a recipient or not, must:

- Repay the first installment of the monetary benefit received for the academic year 2026-2027 and forfeit the second installment if eligible.
- Repay the funds received for complimentary meals.
- Return any additional support received for international mobility and/or internships.

An **exemption** is granted to students who achieve the specified credit count by November 30, 2027. They will waive the second installment but won't be required to reimburse any funds received for the academic year 2025-2026, if applicable. The student whose eligibility is revoked must settle the academic tuition fees for the academic year 2026-2027, based on the prevailing rates, by regularizing their financial status with the Fees, Funding, and Housing Office.

The sole exception applies to revoked students who manage to attain the specified credit count by **November 30, 2027**. They will maintain complete exemption from paying academic tuition fees for the academic year 2026-2027 and won't incur any charges.

All credits must be earned by August 10, 2026.

2.2.3 BONUS

To meet the minimum merit requirements necessary for applying for financial aid under the Right to University Education, students may utilize bonus credits if not already utilized. For the first year, this bonus amounts to 5 credits (thus setting the actual threshold at 44 credits).

The bonus can be used **just once**: if not used, it will grow as stated by the last table. However, if partially used you can use the remaining difference (For instance, if you are at 47 credits in the first year, you must use the bonus for the missing 2 credits. Then, you are left with 3 credits to eventually use in the second year)

The bonus is not applicable for retrospective confirmation of the first year.

3.3 ENROLLMENT REQUIREMENTS

The application can be done by anyone who:

- Enrolls at Bocconi University for the first time ever in the academic year 2026-2027 for a **regular year** of a degree program, master's degree program, single-cycle master's degree program, or Ph.D.
- Enrolls at Bocconi University for the **first time ever in the academic year 2026-2027 in the first year outside the regular program** of the three-year degree program, master's degree program, or single-cycle master's degree program.

4. RESULTS

The window for submitting documentation regarding off-site or commuter status is as follows: for students beyond the first year, complete the dedicated online section and upload the required documentation by August 31st; for first-year students, complete the dedicated online section by August 31st and upload the required documentation by September 21st. Consequently, the provisional ranking will be released in **mid-October 2026**, with the final ranking following by the end of the same month.

5. CONFIRMATION OF BENEFITS

The ISU Bocconi Scholarship is awarded for the academic year in which the application is made and is not **automatically** renewed for subsequent academic years.

Therefore, students interested in receiving the benefit must apply for its assignment **each academic year** of enrollment if they meet the necessary criteria.

6. REVOCATION AND FORFEITURE

6.1 REVOCATION

The eligibility for ISU Bocconi benefits is revoked under the following circumstances:

- The student provides **false** statements;
- The student receives **disciplinary actions** beyond a warning;
- The student **fails to confirm** their enrollment for the academic year 2026-2027 by November 30, 2026;
- The student **fails to meet the merit requirements** evaluated ex post;

6.2 FORFEITURE

We talk about forfeiture of the benefits when:

- The student **fails to submit** required documentation to ISU Bocconi within the specified timeframe and manner;
- The student **discontinues their studies** during the academic year;
- The student **transfers to another university** during the academic year;

7. HOW TO OBTAIN ISEEU PARIFICATO FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

7.1 HOW TO OBTAIN IT?

The **ISEEU** parificato certificate is exclusively issued by the Centro di Assistenza Fiscale (CAF) affiliated with Bocconi University. To request the ISEEU parificato certificate, students must submit all required documents listed below via email to bocconidocuments@sicil.eu

The **application and document submission** to CAF can commence from December 1, 2025. Documents submitted to the CAF office must be legalized, if necessary, and accompanied by an official translation. Given the time-consuming nature of these procedures, students are advised to obtain the necessary documents well in advance to ensure timely submission of the application.

7.2 DOCUMENTS REQUIRED

- Copy of a **valid ID** (Passport, identity card) and **fiscal code**. If the student does not possess an official fiscal code, it will be calculated by the CAF office.
- **Certificate of family household** issued by the relevant authority, listing all family members.
- **Income tax declaration** for the calendar year 2024 for each family member, clearly indicating incomes for the said year.
- **Certificate from the Revenue Office** confirming the absence of the official income tax return for the calendar year 2024, for family members aged 18 and above who do not possess an income tax declaration.
- **Monthly payslips for the entire calendar year 2024** for employees and/or retirees, issued by the employer or social security authority.

- **Certificazione Unica 2025 for the student**, indicating income for 2024, in case the student received university scholarships for Right of University Education in Italy during 2024.
- **Documentation of real estate ownership** by family members as of December 31, 2024, including square meter details, issued by the relevant public authority. If no real estate was owned in 2024, a certificate confirming the absence of ownership must be provided for each household member aged 18 and above.
- **Official documentation of movable assets** of the family household as of December 31, 2024, including:
 1. Bank and/or deposit account balances.
 2. Account balances of shares, dividends, shareholdings, capitalization policies, and other financial investments.

For **individuals or companies engaged in business activities** as of December 31, 2024, submission of a Financial Statement form provided by Bocconi University. The form must be completed, signed, and approved by the appointed accountant. This document must be uploaded along with the ISEEU parificato in the online application.

In the **absence of sole proprietorship or business activities** by any family member, completion and submission of the "Declaration of Absence of Sole Proprietorship or Business Activities" form. For minor students, the signature of the parent with legal authority is required. This document must be uploaded along with the ISEEU parificato in the online application.

Separation or divorce decree in case of parental separation or divorce.

In addition to the above documentation, one of the following documents must be submitted to the CAF office:

- For **non-first year students** in the academic year 2026-2027: "Autodichiarazione anni Iscrizione", a self-declaration of enrollment at Bocconi University for the academic year 2025-2026, downloadable from the yoU@B diary.
- For **first year students in the academic year 2026-2027**: a document confirming enrollment for the academic year 2026-2027 ("confirmation letter" to be printed from the enrollment procedure in My Application).

7.2.1 IMPORTANT NOTES

- Documents must be **issued by the relevant authorities** of the country where income was generated and/or assets are owned.
- Documents **must be legalized** by Italian diplomatic or consular missions abroad or Apostille stamped (for documents issued by public authorities), where required.
- Documents must be in the **original language** and accompanied by an **Italian translation** consistent with the foreign text (for documents in a foreign language), certified by the relevant diplomatic or consular mission or an official translator.
